

HOW OUR STUDENTS ARE DOING

To help you make a good decision about whether to sign up for our **MAINTENANCE TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM, TETERBORO SCHOOL OF AERONAUTICS** wants you to know that according to the latest 2017 ACCSC Report, submitted on 10/05/2018....

We started 123 students in the A&P program, 0 in the Airframe program and 0 in the Powerplant program. So 70%, or 86 of the 123 students in the A&P program who started in 2015 and scheduled to graduate between 6/06/16 and 6/02/17 went on to graduate. 1 of the graduates is deceased so that leaves 85 graduates.

**65%, or 55 of the 85 A&P students scheduled to graduate in that year have found jobs in Maintenance, Overhaul, Repair and Manufacturing, encompassing Aerospace, Aviation & Industrial fields.

** 14 of the students scheduled to graduate in this period have not responded to any of our job inquiries so we do not know whether they have found jobs or not.

The figures on the previous page were compiled from our placement records for the students who started in 2015, and displayed according to Office of Education guidelines. The figures show that 55 of 85 students, who successfully completed the A&P course, have been placed. It should be noted that of the 30 (thirty) graduates shown as not being placed, 5 (five) have not received their certificates and we do not have verification that twenty (20) of those graduates have gotten their FAA license, and therefore are not qualified for employment as F.A.A. licensed aircraft mechanics/technicians.

Of the thirty seven (37) students not completing the training, one (1) decided to take his tests on military time, one (1) withdrew for military, one (1) informed us that they decided to attend college, and one (1) was relocating.

To summarize, if you take into account the (25)graduates that appear to have not received their license, 55 of 60 available graduates, who started the course in 2015 and scheduled to graduate between 6/06/16 and 6/02/17, were placed in jobs. This translates to a 92% placement rate.
