know that according to the latest 2017 ACCSC Report, submitted on 10/17/2017

We started 119 students in the A&P program, 0 in the Airframe program and 0 in the Powerplant program. So 61%, or 73 of the 119 students in the A&P program who started in 2014 and scheduled to graduate between 6/08/15 and 4/15/16 went on to graduate.

**60%, or 44 of the 73 A&P students scheduled to graduate in that year have found jobs in Maintenance, Overhaul, Repair and Manufacturing, encompassing Aerospace, Aviation & Industrial fields. (This percentage differs from the Accreditation Report as a few graduates notified us that they were working in the field after the report was submitted .)

^{** 18} of the students scheduled to graduate in this period have not responded to any of our job inquiries so we do not know whether they have found jobs or not.

The figures on the previous page were compiled from our placement records for the students who started in 2014, and displayed according to Office of Education guidelines. The figures show that 44 of 73 students, who successfully completed the A&P course, have been placed. It should be noted that of the 29 (twenty nine) graduates shown as not being placed, we do not have verification on twenty seven (27) of those graduates that they have gotten their FAA license, and therefore are not qualified for employment as F.A.A. licensed aircraft mechanics/technicians.

Of the <u>forty six (46)</u> students not completing the training, one (1) found a job in a field related to his training, two (2) withdrew for military, two (2) informed us that they decided to attend college, three (3) decided that they had no interest in the school and one (1) decided he wanted to change his career.

To summarize, if you take into account the (27)graduates that appear to have not received their license, 44 of 46 <u>available graduates</u>, who started the course in 2014 and scheduled to graduate between 6/08/15 and 4/15/16, were placed in jobs. This translates to a 96% placement rate.
