

HOW OUR STUDENTS ARE DOING

To help you make a good decision about whether to sign up for our **MAINTENANCE TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM, TETERBORO SCHOOL OF AERONAUTICS** wants you to know that according to the latest 2016 ACCSC Report, submitted on 10/07/2016....

We started 138 students in the A&P program, 0 in the Airframe program and 0 in the Powerplant program. 1 student was not available for graduation. So 65%, or 89 of the 137 students in the A&P program who started in 2013 and scheduled to graduate between 6/09/14 and 4/17/15 went on to graduate.

****66%**, or 59 of the 89 A&P students scheduled to graduate in that year have found jobs in Maintenance, Overhaul, Repair and Manufacturing, encompassing Aerospace, Aviation & Industrial fields.

**** 20** of the students scheduled to graduate in this period have not responded to any of our job inquiries so we do not know whether they have found jobs or not.

The figures on the previous page were compiled from our placement records for the students who started in 2013, and displayed according to Office of Education guidelines. The figures show that 59 of 89 students, who successfully completed the A&P course, have been placed. Of the forty eight (48) students not completing the training, two (2) found jobs in fields related to their training, two (2) withdrew for military and one (3) decided to attend college, 1 moved back to India with his family, and one relocated to Florida with his family.

It should be noted that of the 30 (thirty) graduates shown as not being placed, we do not have verification on twenty six (26) of those graduates that they have gotten their FAA license, and therefore are not qualified for employment as F.A.A. licensed aircraft mechanics/technicians.

To summarize, if you take into account the graduates that appear to have not received their license, 59 of 63 available graduates, who started the course in 2013 and scheduled to graduate between 6/09/14 and 4/17/14 , were placed in jobs. This translates to a 94% placement rate.
